UNRUH: The Reality of Higher Education

Jesse Unruh, an announced candidate for governor of California, called for more student participation in the "real world" in an address on higher education at Beckman Auditorium on November 25.

Unruh's address was part of a two-day "Leaders of America" program sponsored by the Caltech YMCA. During his two days on campus the minority leader of the California Assembly participated in three briefing sessions by Caltech faculty, an informal seminar in Winnett Lounge, and a noon talk on the Olive Walk.

In the Beckman lecture he attacked a proposal to charge tuition at the state universities and colleges and outlined an internship program that he felt would answer the demands of both activist students and their detractors.

Unruh told the audience that "today's students are breaking out of their traditionally cloistered environments on their own to become active in community work, and to criticize both their educational institutions and their chosen pro-

fessions. They are objecting to the colleges' isolation from social and urban problems, the under-representation of nonwhite students, and the overemphasis on technical training at the expense of dealing with the social and human impact of the professions.

"Many students are struggling to attend school and earn a living at the same time, and they are finding it difficult to cope with an educational system which still reflects the philosophy that higher education is a bucolic, four-year hiatus from the real world and its material obligations. Students' concerns, in short, are really not that different from the rest of society."

Citing Caltech's student research center and its studies on elimination of smog and improvement of teaching methods in public schools as an outstanding example of how students can participate in the life of the community, Unruh said: "This need for participation in life and its evolution is a drive which we cannot afford

NEWS IN BRIEF

DuBridge Professorship

The Associates of the California Institute of Technology have launched a fund-raising project to establish and endow a Lee A. DuBridge professorship in honor of the Institute's former president, who is now President Nixon's special assistant for science and technology. The Associates are a group of public-spirited citizens (now numbering about 400), interested in the advancement of learning, who were incorporated in 1926 as a non-profit organization "for the purpose of promoting the interests of the California Institute of Technology." While they hope that the professorship may be rotated among the various fields of scholarship at Caltech, The Associates would like their first candidate to be someone whose interests are "in an area of biological sciences in which an understanding of behavior is important or in an area of science or technology which is closely associated with Dr. DuBridge's career or interests."

Arms Talks

Harold Brown is a member of the six-man delegation appointed by President Nixon to represent the United States at a series of strategic arms limitation conferences with the Soviet Union. Brown, accompanied by his wife, Colene, arrived in Helsinki November 12 for the first of the talks, designed to determine topics, ground rules, and a meeting place for future discussions. President Brown says he will probably not participate in the talks more than once a year.

Honorary Degree

Harrison S. Brown, professor of geochemistry and of science and government, received an honorary Doctor of Science degree from the University of Cambridge on November 1, which marked the 150th anniversary of the Cambridge Philosophical Society.

Armin Deutsch

Armin J. Deutsch, astronomer at the Mt. Wilson and Palomar Observatories since 1951, died November 11 of a heart ailment and complications. Deutsch, a staff member of the Carnegie Institution of Washington and of the Royal Astronomical Society, studied the composition and rotation of stars, star clusters, cool stars with unusual chromospheric activities, and a group of magnetic stars called peculiar A stars. He also discovered that giant red stars generate great stellar winds which carry matter through space.

Community Relations


Aron Kuppermann, professor of chemical physics, has been appointed by Harold Brown to head Caltech's administrative committee on community relations. Kuppermann and the Institute's director of community relations, James Black, will work with interested persons and groups in Pasadena and southern California in improving the "physical, educational, social, and economic environment" of the community. The committee will intensify its efforts in the areas of public education and the quality of the Los Angeles Basin environment.

Chemistry Award

Cornelius Pings, professor of chemical engineering, won the \$1,000 Professional Progress Award for 1969 from the American Institute of Chemical Engineers. The award recognizes his work in "theoretical and experimental developments in the fundamental behavior of fluids, particularly in the critical region."

Lecture Grant

The Shell Oil Companies have given a \$5,000 grant to finance one or two lectureships at Caltech in 1970. They will involve a series of technical lectures for students and faculty, possibly on the topics of aircraft noise and large-scale fires, and a general lecture open to the public in Beckman Auditorium. The Shell Oil Companies are members of Caltech's Industrial Associates.

"Second Sober Thoughts"

Fred W. Friendly Speaks of Agnew and American Television

Former CBS news president Fred W. Friendly, a member of Caltech's visiting committee for humanities and social sciences, spoke to a noontime Olive Walk crowd on November 21 in answer to Vice President Spiro Agnew's attack on television newscasters. His speech, "Some Second Sober Thoughts on Vice President Agnew," sponsored by the Caltech YMCA, called for more, not less, interpretive reporting. "We require bolder, not blander, illumination of the issues which divide men of reason," he said.

Friendly, now the Edward R. Murrow Professor of Broadcast Journalism at Columbia University, defended the TV analysis following President Nixon's latest Vietnam speech, then faulted himself for agreeing to postpone analysis of President Johnson's Tonkin Gulf speech in 1964.

"In spite of the pleas of our Washington bureau," Friendly said, "I made the decision to leave the air two minutes after the President concluded his remarks. I shall always believe that, if journalism had done its job properly that night and in the days following, America might have been spared some of the agony that followed the Tonkin Gulf Resolution."

Friendly told his Caltech listeners: "Where Mr. Agnew went astray, in my view, was in his suggestion that the media ought somehow to be a conduit for the views of the government, or merely a reflector of public opinion. He was not the first, nor the last, high official to equate fairness and the possession of great power with the obligation of conformity."

The ex-chief of CBS news said he shares the Vice President's view that television leaves something to be desired, and that the geographic and corporate concentration of power in broadcasting is a matter for concern. But he added: "He had the right target, but a misdirected aim. His criticism of broadcasters for centralization and conformity better describes the commercial system and its single-minded interest in maximum ratings . . . This

system minimizes the presentation of hard news and analysis, leading the broadcast journalists into occasional overdramatization in the interest of impact." He went on to say that he believes some tendencies toward distortion do exist; however, the proper action of the government is not censorship but expansion and diversification of the broadcasting system and environment in which professional journalists work.

Friendly, who is also the Ford Foundation's adviser on television, called on Agnew to support a national public television network that would have the independence and high quality of England's BBC. Such a noncommercial system would require VHF channels in every major city and a budget of at least \$100 million a year. The money, Friendly said, could be raised through a tax on TV sets, as is done in England, or by contributions from the profits of commercial television.

NEW TRUSTEES

Caltech's board of trustees has elected four new members: George W. Beadle, 66, Nobel Prizewinner in physiology and medicine, former chairman of Caltech's division of biology, and director of the American Medical Association's Institute for Biomedical Research; Otis Chandler, 41, publisher of the *Los Angeles Times* and the third member of his family to serve on Caltech's board; Robert S. McNamara, 53, former Secretary of Defense and now president of the World Bank; and Ruben F. Mettler, 45, assistant president and executive vice president of TRW Inc. and chairman of President Nixon's task force on science policy. At their national meeting November 1 the trustees voted to increase the size of the board from 40 to 45 in an effort to represent a wider variety of interests from all areas of the country. The four new trustees bring the membership to 42.

to ignore. In fact, I think we would do well to incorporate this desire directly into our higher educational system as a means of reconnecting the university with the real world by giving the student a sense of participation in society rather than increasing his alienation from it."

In his talk on the Olive Walk the following day, Unruh said he had learned a great deal from the "educate-the-governor program," as the *Los Angeles Times* called his briefings at Caltech, and said he was impressed by the fact that "we had overcome some of the problems we were told were impossible to overcome . . . I believe if we really want to solve our problems, the physical solutions are before us, and most of them are with us today."

In the first briefing session, "The Future of Science," Unruh heard faculty members George Hammond on "the problem of

priorities," Lester Lees on "understanding complex systems," Ray Owen on "biology and biomedical problems," and Fred Thompson on "a bridge between biology and social science."

In the second session, "Man and His Environment," he heard Norman Brooks on "coastal pollution control," James Morgan on "the chemical quality of the environment," Jack McKee on "waste management," John Seinfeld on "air quality," and Wheeler North on "man's impact on marine ecology."

In the final briefing session, Unruh listened to approaches to "Economic and Social Problems" from Roger Noll on "ghetto unemployment," John Benton on "community action," Murray Gell-Mann on "the reform of education," Lance Davis on "new political coalitions and social choice," and Robert Oliver on "public finance and local politics."

Students, Alumni Discuss Housing

The current presidents of Caltech's seven student houses; 17 alumni (all former house presidents); and trustees Arnold Beckman, Henry Dreyfuss, and William Zisch met at a dinner on November 12 to discuss the good and bad aspects of on-campus student housing.

Chip Smith, president of Page House, gave a talk in which he indicated that in spite of existing problems of noise and overcrowding most students find on-campus living more congenial than is generally supposed.

The dinner was part of a continuing program designed to bring alumni and students together in small groups. Two more discussions, one on the "student research associates" who came from predominantly black colleges to work at the ASCIT Research Center, and one on athletics at Caltech, are scheduled for next term.

Race For Clean Air

New kinds of lower pollution vehicles—electric, steam, turbine, hybrids, etc.—will compete in a Clean Air Car Race scheduled to run over public roads between California and Massachusetts in September 1970.

An outgrowth and expansion of the Great Electric Car Race in the fall of 1968 between cars built and operated by students at Caltech and MIT, the clean air car race will be open to vehicles designed and built by any organization, including commercial and foreign groups.

The competition will consist of three parts: short distance events emphasizing performance, safety, and energy consumption; a race from MIT to Caltech; and air pollution emission measurements to be made in California at the conclusion of the cross-country race. Prizes will be awarded to the winner of each phase as well as to the over-all winner.

Organizers of the contest, Richard B. Thornton, MIT professor of electrical engineering, and Jerome Shapiro, Caltech professor of applied science, have set the entrance deadline at February 28, 1970. Prospective contestants should contact either organizer and obtain a copy of preliminary rules from the public relations offices of either institution. No vehicle will be barred provided it produces less air pollution than is specified by the 1974 California standards.

Football Is Still Fun At Caltech

On a chilly autumn afternoon in 1869 a rugged bunch of moustached students from Princeton and Rutgers took part in a roughnecked, free-for-all variation of English rugby that has come to be known as American football. Although the "game" was only slightly more refined than a street fight, no one called the cops.

A hundred years after that first Princeton-Rutgers match, a relatively clean-shaven squad of Caltech students took on a combination of freshmen and sophomore players from Claremont-Harvey Mudd and came out on the short end of a 34-0 score.

The setback from Claremont-Mudd marked the finale of a winless season for the 28-man Caltech team, but, to a man, they were ready to give it a try again next year. Coach Tom Gutman, a man of great hopes and even greater patience, said: "This was a building year. Next season we will have more experience, and, if the alumni give us some help, we will have more players."

Gutman had words of praise for his seniors led by team co-captains Alan Beagle and Dennis Pucekay, who had tasted victory only once in four years (last year against UC San Diego, in its first—and only—season of football). Other seniors, who did yeoman duty on offense and defense, included Bob Vance, Eric Jensen, and John Messmer. Gutman also singled out the "bearded one," Mike Brennan, for his efforts as fullback. Probably the most harried player on the field in Caltech's final effort of the season was freshman quarterback Bob Bales who spent his time running for his life on offense, and trying to stop opposing ends a foot taller from catching the ball on defense.

Bales and the rest of the freshmen on the Caltech squad will probably face some long afternoons in the next three years. They will not play before sellout crowds in the Coliseum, nor will they see their names in headlines from coast to coast. But they will have fun; and that is what the boys from Rutgers and Princeton really had in mind when they got together that afternoon in 1869.

Chemist Saul Winstein Dies

Saul Winstein, PhD '38, professor of chemistry at UCLA, died November 23 of an apparent heart attack. He was 57.

A leader in physical organic chemistry, Winstein had done research as a graduate student at Caltech with Howard Lucas and devised a remarkably perceptive interpretation of the complex molecular motions that must be involved in some superficially simple chemical reactions. He continued his early promise and became one of the world's premier geniuses in creating and testing models for the complex pattern of motions and bonding interactions that must occur during the reactions of complex molecules.

He combined two rare characteristics, a truly creative imagination and an ability to design sharply discriminating tests for his own and other theories. The impact of his work has been felt throughout a wide spectrum of chemical science and technology.

In addition to his direct contributions to research, Winstein established a viable style of work that has been adopted by many other workers in the field. Several hundred people—graduate students, post-doctoral research fellows, and visiting faculty fellows—came to UCLA to be associated with him during the past two decades. Without exception, these associates derived lasting stimulation from the experience.

He went to UCLA in 1941 as an instructor, and was a full professor by 1947. A member of the National Academy of Sciences, his awards included the ACS Pure Chemistry Award in 1949, the ACS Richards Medal in 1962, the McCoy Award in 1966, the Norris Award in 1968, and the Franklin Memorial Award in 1968. He also won distinguished alumni awards from both UCLA and Caltech.

He leaves his wife, Sylvia; a son, Bruce, a physics graduate student at Caltech; and a daughter, Carolee, a sophomore at UCLA.


